Greek uses the same form to describe both. These verbs belong to the **present tense** because they are taking place at this precise moment.

(Actions which occur in the past are **past tenses** and actions which are going to happen are **future tenses**).

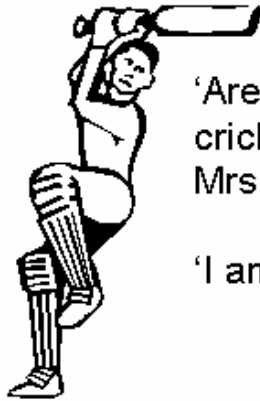
