

## Describing yourself using adjectives

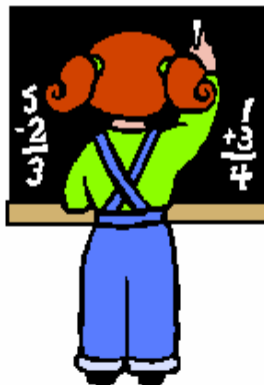
If you want to describe yourself, you use εἶμι (**I am**) and a special word called an **adjective** (a describing word).

In English, we use the same form of the adjective whether we are male or female, but in Greek you use different forms for **masculine** and **feminine**.



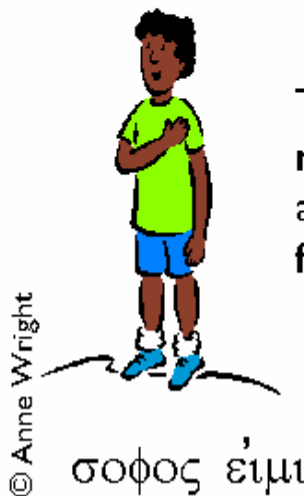
So if a boy states 'I am wise',  
he says σοφος εἶμι

σοφος = **wise**      εἶμι = **I am**



But if a girl states 'I am wise',  
she says, σοφη εἶμι

σοφη = **wise**      εἶμι = **I am**

The difference is that  
**masculine adjectives** end in ος  
and most  
**feminine adjectives** end in η.
