Seminar Report

A graduate seminar series entitled “Textual Criticism on Literary Fragments” took place during Hilary Term 2018 (January-March) at the Faculty of Classics, University of Oxford. It was co-ordinated by Roberta Berardi and Dimitrios Kanellakis and funded by the Craven Committee.

The meetings were held every Monday of the term, for eight weeks, from 17:00 to 18:30, and were followed by wine reception and a complimentary dinner for the speakers. The programme run as planned. On 15 January, Patrick Finglass (Bristol) gave a presentation on *Stesichorus on Phaedra*. On 22 January, Daniela Colomo (Oxford) gave a presentation on *Reconstructing Menander's Georgos: An Unpublished Papyrus from the Leipzig Collection*. On 29 January, Amin Benaissa (Oxford) gave a presentation on *The Fragments of Dionysius' Bassarica in Stephanus of Byzantium*. On 5 February, Wolfgang De Melo (Oxford) gave a presentation on *Varro's fragments of De lingua Latina*. On 12 February, Massimo Pinto (Bari) gave a presentation on *Cleochares of Myrlea*. On 19 February, Gesine Manuwald (UCL) gave a presentation on *How to read a fragment: some thoughts on the remains of Roman tragedy*. On 26 February, Stephen Heyworth (Oxford) gave a presentation on *[Tibullus] 3.19*. On 5 March, Elizabeth Jeffreys (Oxford) gave a presentation on *Malalas: a snapper up of unconsidered trifles?*

All sessions were well-attended. The seminar brought together graduate students, postdoctoral researchers, and professors from Oxford, other British universities, and universities from abroad. Thanks to your generous grant of £200, we have been able to offer ten travel bursaries to non-Oxford graduate students.
