Now I don't want to be thought
to use the A.M.E. for my own advantage,
but if the Committee thinks that the

I am writing to Kiepert & Perrot trying
various meetings in Switzerland, Paris,
Berlin or elsewhere, as they may happen to
be for the holiday seasons. Of course, if
the grant is made, circumstances may
make it more ridiculous for me not to
use it: I may find other difficulties in
the way of carrying out the scheme.
Meantime, if the Committee agrees, I will ask
you to telegraph the single word "yes" to Brit.
Consulate, Smyrna, early in September. If
the Committee believes it more advantageous
to A.M.E. to spend the money in other ways
next year, please treat this letter as unwritten.

My dear Macmillan,

It would bring considerable
gain to my schemes, if I could see Kiepert and
Perrot on my way home this autumn. I wish
also to see Hamdi Bey in Stambol, in order to ask
about the chance of being allowed to do a little
excavating next year on condition that all
finds should be given to the Imperial Museum.
I have discovered a mound, which may yield
very important results, as I have dug out
of the side of it one stone with an early
inscription.

Now, in returning from
Smyrna to England, we can both get a passage
in a steamer for sixteen pounds 11*q.*, both
included and all our goods carried free.
on the other hand to go across Europe will
cost £50 and more perhaps, while our
goods shipped will take other £5.
