Dear Mr. Ramsay

On receiving your letter of Dec. 18 I thought the simplest plan would be to refer the question to which they relate to Blunt's father. He authorizes me to say that, so far as the <sup>concerns</sup> <sup>an</sup> honorarium

of the day  provided by the Hellenic Society for your son's services as a draftsman, he is willing that the whole of this sum which if three months services are accomplished will amount to £90 should be devoted to the necessary expenses of the expedition. But he is not prepared to sanction

his son's <sup>in excess of the</sup> liability for any ~~further~~ <sup>whatever</sup> sum, <sup>and</sup> ~~without~~ the expenses of travelling may amount to. In case the expedition should terminate ~~much~~ <sup>sooner</sup> than you ~~at~~ <sup>originally</sup> anticipated so that you will not require Mr Blunt's services for so long a period, there will remain from the £90 an unexpended balance

which will have to be  
disposed of as the Council  
of the Hellenic Society  
may think fit, and  
respecting which they will  
send you their instructions
