Thanks to the generosity of the Hellenic Society, between the end of May and the beginning

of June 2018 I have been able to enjoy two full weeks of focused and productive study at the

Fondation Hardt in Vandœuvres (Geneva). This has allowed me to finally complete two

articles on which I had been working for long: one on Aelius Aristides and New Music,

forthcoming in Greek and Roman Musical Studies; and one on ancient and modern reception

of two Pindaric fragments on war, submitted to Arion, A Journal of Humanities and the

Classics). Even more importantly, during my stay I finally started the editing of the draft of

my PhD thesis on the reception of archaic and classical lyric in the Second Sophistic.

Being a guest at the Fondation Hardt, moreover, has given me the invaluable opportunity of

spending time and discussing with other younger and older scholars over meals and during

receptions. I particularly enjoyed this aspect of the study life at the Fondation, for the coming

and going of guests from all over the world has enriched and made more lively the process of

concentrating upon my own work. During peaceful walks, I have also been able to appreciate

the ideal location of the Fondation, its lovely garden, and its proximity to the beautiful Lake

Geneva.

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
