Brief description of the project for which the grant was applied for and subsequently used:

The London Summer School in Classics offered eight days of intensive teaching in ancient Greek and Latin. It also offered Beginners' classes in Coptic, New Testament/Koine Greek and Biblical Hebrew, as well as Intermediate Biblical Hebrew. Teaching took place over 8 days (9-18 July), offering 4 hours of language teaching per day, as well as afternoon lectures and workshops on various aspects of Classical Civilization and languages. The course was non-residential and there was no teaching over the weekend.

The Summer school caters for school and university students, and for anyone else who wishes to learn or revive the knowledge of the aforementioned languages. Previous participants have included: students with no prior knowledge of the languages; pre-GCSE/GCSE and A-level students; university students; mature applicants who wish to expand their linguistic knowledge.
