The Library

One of the major Classics libraries in the world, the collection has been built up since the late 19th century and has excellent coverage of literature, archaeology, papyrology, epigraphy, ancient history, numismatics as well as works on society, economy, trade and subjects such as reception studies.

The Collection and Librarians

- Most of the collection is on open access on one floor with **6 reading** rooms dedicated to different subject areas.
- Today, the Library contains over 157,000 volumes, including 22,000 periodical volumes, with more than 700 active subscriptions.
- **50%** of the collection is published outside the UK; **15%** of the collection is uniquely held here.
- The Library holds about **2000 old and rare books** (1501-1800), 18th & 19th century travel diaries and published books by travellers in Greece and the eastern Mediterranean, and an archive on ancient mosaics.
- Ask our **Classicist librarians** for help with database-searching and any other queries.
