

A meeting of Council

was held at 22 Albemarle St on Thursday May
26 at 5. P.M. Members present: Messrs
Newton, Thompson, Jebb, Bywater, Gardner, Browning,
Myers & Macmillan.

Mr Newton being voted into the Chair the
minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed.
The following who had been proposed at

last meeting were duly elected members of the Society : viz: Messrs Hollway-Calthrop, F. S. Sandford, Arthur Cates, Basile Melas, Michele Melas, Menelas Regopontis, Athanasius Montzopoulos, Demetrios Schilizzi, Eleutherios Rigadis, Pantaleon Theologos, J. P. Sagrandi, G. Parisis, John Serghiadis, Basile N. Boudouris, and Professor von Duhn.

After fresh candidates had been proposed the Hon. Sec. laid before the meeting the following accounts which were duly passed & cheques drawn in settlement of them : viz: Messrs Clay Sons & Taylor for Printing, & for carriage of Journal £ 8^u 2^m 9^d, Mr Vaux for Book Case £ 6^u 2^m 6^d, Mr Bellot for drawing Pallas & Vase £ 6^u 6^d, and Messrs Macmillan & Co for Stationery & Postage £ 5. 8. 2.

The question was then again brought forward of the principle ^{on which} the third of the Council to retire at the general meeting should be selected. A list was drawn up of those who had never or only very rarely attended meetings. Of these nine were selected in the course of discussion viz: the Dean of Westminster, Professors Kennedy, H. J. S. Smith, & Bonamy Price Messrs Coxe, Balfour, Symonds Penrose & Wilde. A list was then drawn up of some sixteen possible candidates for election in place of the nine retiring.

Some difference of opinion arising in the selection.
Prof. Jebb proposed that a vote should be taken
both as to the nine who should retire, and those
who ~~to~~^{should} take their places. The result of
the voting on the first head was that the Dean of
Westminster with 8 votes against him, Professors Henry
Smith & Bonamy Price messrs Balfour & Coxe with
the same number, Professor Kennedy & Mr Penrose
with 7, Mr Wilde with 6, & Professor Mahaffy with
5 votes were selected to retire. In their places
were elected S William Smith (6 votes) Mr S.H. Butcher (7),
Prof A. Goodwin (7), Prof S.C. Ward (6), Mr W. Wayte (6),
Mr J.E. Sandys (5), Rev E.L. Hicks (7), Mr Peile (6),
and Mr Andrew Lang (6).

The Hon. Secretary was then instructed
to inform those on the first list that their names
had by vote been selected for withdrawal, and to
invite those on the second list to fill the vacant
places on the Council. ~~Thenceforward~~^{up to} ~~the next~~
In ~~any~~ case of any refusal on the part of the proposed
new Councillors he was instructed to invite Mr W.L.
Hewman (who obtained 5 votes) to fill the vacancy. The
meeting then broke up.
