

A meeting of Council

was held on Thursday Oct. 13. 1881 at 5 P.M. at 22 Albemarle St.
members present: Messrs Tozer, Pennadius, Lang, Butcher,
Myers, Gardner, Pelham & Macmillan.

Mr Tozer being voted into the Chair the minutes
of the last meeting were read & confirmed.

The following were elected members of the Society:

of Greek Letters at Athens.

Fresh candidates having been proposed the Hon. Sec. read letters from M^r Blunt & M^r Ramsay formally accepting the terms proposed by the Council for the expedition into Asia Minor, and stated that he had accordingly made payments as instructed by the Council at last meeting.

The Hon. Sec. then submitted the following accounts which were duly passed, & cheques drawn for their payment: To Messrs Clay Sons & Taylor £167^{..} 6; to Messrs Dickinson & Co £17^{..} 5; to the Royal Asiatic Society £12^{..} 10; to J. D. Cooper £10^{..} 14; and to J. Pinches £5^{..} 11^{..} 8.

The question was then raised of the papers to be read at the General Meeting on October 20, and on the proposal of M^r Gardner it was decided that M^r Tozer's paper on Byzantine Satire, M^r Cecil Smith's on the Costume in the Birds of Aristophanes, & M^r Watkins Lloyd's on the Battle of Marathon, should be read.

The Hon. Sec. then re-introduced the question of the proposed exchange of journals between the Society and the Cambridge Philological Society, and after some discussion it was decided that the proposal should

be acceded to, with the suggestion that on our sending the Journal of Hellenic Studies from the beginning, the Camb. Philological Society should send the back volumes of the Journal of Philology.

The question of the books belonging to the Society was once more brought forward with a view to deciding as to their availability to members, & the desirability of adding to their number by purchase. It was moved by Mr Jennaduis & carried

That a Sub-Committee be appointed to consider the following questions, & to report to the Council thereon: 1) the Conditions under which the library is being or is to be formed, (2) the custody & classification of the library (3) the use of the library by members, and (4) the financial aspect of the question.

It was further resolved That the Sub-committee shall consist of Mr Jennaduis, Mr Myers, Mr Gardner, & Mr Macmillan (Hon. Sec).

The question arising of the dates to be fixed for the General Meetings in 1882 the Hon. Sec. was instructed to go into the matter & submit a list of days for approval by the Council at their next meeting. The meeting then broke up.
