

## A meeting of Council

was held at 22 Albemarle St on Thursday Oct. 20 at 4.30 P.M.  
members present: Messrs Tozer, Fennadius, Thompson,  
Gardner, Butcher, Myers, & Macmillan (Hon. Sec.)

In<sup>r</sup> Tozer being voted into the Chair the minutes of the  
last meeting were read & confirmed.

The following were elected members of the Society, Rev  
John Langhorne, M<sup>r</sup> J. C. Farver, S<sup>r</sup> Emil Tudeer, Prof. S. T.  
Armstrong, Prof. W<sup>m</sup> Hesbitt, Prof. Hastings Grosley, and  
M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Woolner R. A.

Some fresh candidates having been proposed the  
Secretary brought forward the question of the days to be  
fixed for the general meetings in 1882. It was decided  
that these should be held on Thursday Feb. 14, Thursday  
April 20, Thursday June 15, and Thursday October 19,  
at the same time & place as before.

The Secretary submitted a roller in which the Plates  
accompanying the Journal might be sent to members  
resident abroad at a much lower rate than that  
charged by the Globe Express Co. It was agreed that this  
should be adopted, except where a large number of  
members resident in one place made it worth while to  
make a single parcel to go by Parcels Express to some  
convenient centre of distribution.

The Hon. Sec. read a letter from Professor Goodwin  
of University College, London, resigning his place on the  
Council on the ground that he found himself unable  
to attend meetings. It was decided to accept the resignation  
if Prof. Goodwin was anxious to be relieved of the responsibility,  
but not to fill the vacancy until the next Annual Meeting,  
unless some good reason should arise for doing so. The  
meeting then broke up.
