Brief description of the project for which the grant was applied for and subsequently used:

The grant was used to bring the ancient Greeks topic alive for our pupils in the form of face to face workshops in school. The 3 workshops covered the topic of Perseus and the Gorgon's Head and included traditional Greek costumes and imagery.

Further activities to embed learning include writing about the topic, drawing posters and discussing the content of the workshop. Following on from this, the children used their experience of the story of Perseus and Medusa and have rewritten the Greek myth in their own words. Some fantastic work has been done.
