You know that it was a
suggestion to let Mr. Quaker's Review
have a plan of the Palace of Knossos
in Hogarth's Article - of course a
small sketch was intended -
I strongly urged that for a small
sketch a sketch plan such as to
be in the Annual with perhaps
some additions was wanted. However
Fyfe was apparently much in favour

of supplying it must be left to
