Herewith I return, with many
thanks, the appeals of the Cyprus and
Asia Minor Funds, which you kindly
lent to M. Haussoullier. He writes

Dr. Sebastian Evans writes to ask for
the loan of blocks from Arthur Evans' Reports in the Annual, on behalf of
M. Louis Dimier, a French artist and
archaeologist who is doing some

resumes of the Cretan work for a
French periodical. Arthur Evans consents
so far as he is concerned, but subject
to your consent in so far as the
blocks are reserved for the final
Knossos-publication. If you
consent, I am to send M. Dimier
a set of the Annual, and then he
will apply for clichés of the blocks
which he selects. I do not imagine
he will want many.

comes very conveniently for me, as my
